The Lord’s Supper

Why did Jesus give us this supper to the church until he returns? John Calvin gave these three reasons:

1. The Lord’s Supper confirms in our minds the promises of the gospel unto salvation, by reminding us that we partake of (take part in) the body and blood of the Savior.
2. The Lord’s Supper reminds us of God’s great goodness to us, and leads us to praise him more fully.
3. The Lord’s Supper exhorts us to be holy and innocent, because we are members of Jesus Christ. We ought to be in union with our brothers and sisters, showing the love of Christ as we have been commanded.

The Lord’s Supper is for those who in faith (1) have placed their trust in Jesus Christ for salvation and have accepted him as Lord, (2) have taken the first steps of obedience by being baptized, (3) are in good standing with a Bible believing church, and (4) have sought forgiveness for their sins against God and those whom we have sinned, and have forgiven others for their offenses against us.
